

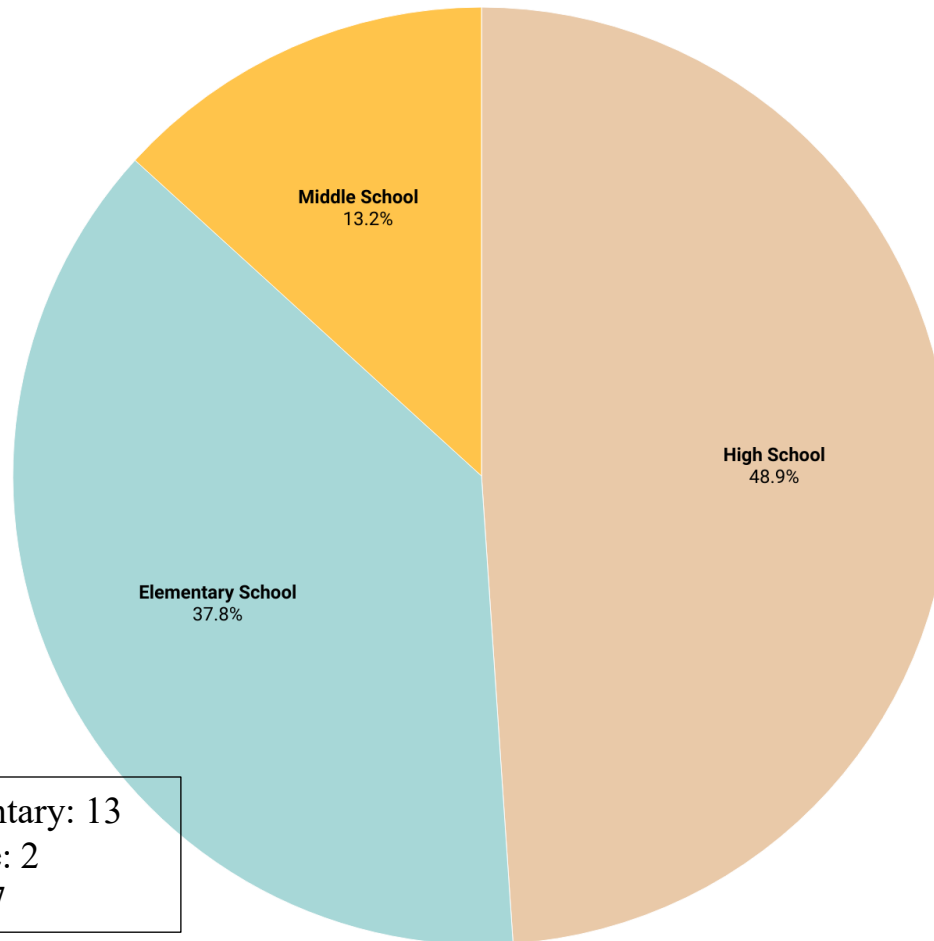


Aggregated Demographic and Services Provided Data for January – June 2023

Note: There was a total of 22 PBHUC partner schools with 16,803 total students enrolled. There were 13 elementary schools who were PBHUC partner schools (grades pre-K through 5th grade) for an enrolment total of 6,357. UP Academy in Dorchester includes grades pre-K - 8th grade and enrollment for 6 - 8th grade were included in the elementary school totals. There were 2 middle schools who were PBHUC partner schools (grades 6th - 8th) for an enrollment total of 2,225. There were 7 high schools as PBHUC partners schools (grades 8th - 12th and post graduate students) for a total enrollment of 8,221. Two high schools in Lynn include 6th - 8th graders and enrollment for these grades were included in the high school totals. Enrollment data were pulled from publicly available data on DESE's website.

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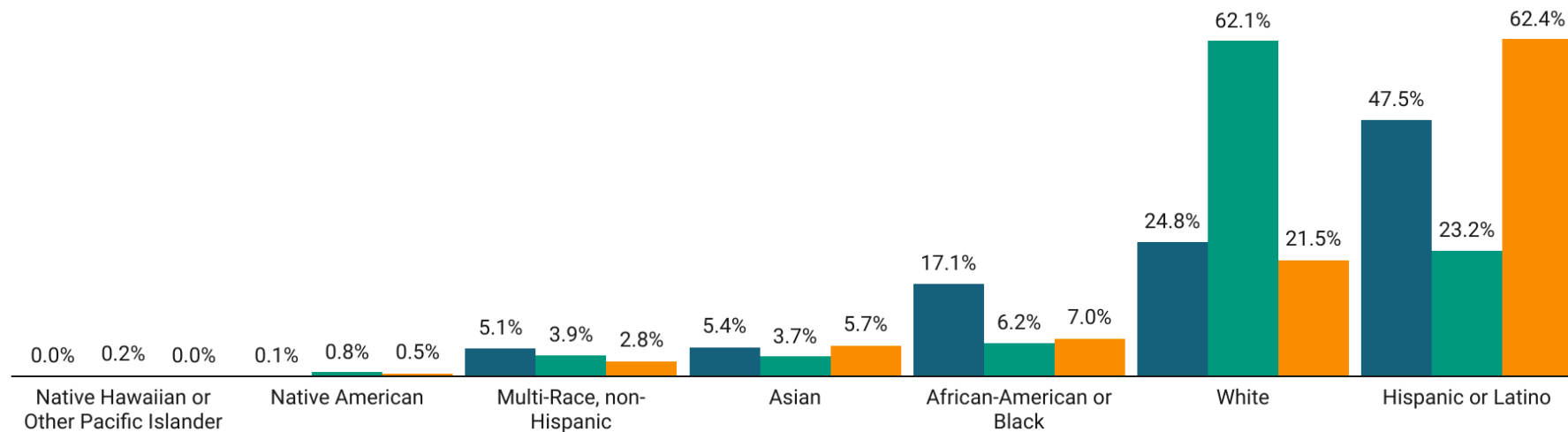




Race and Ethnicity by Grade Level

■ % of students in Elementary School partner schools ■ % of students in Middle School partner schools ■ % of students in High School partner schools

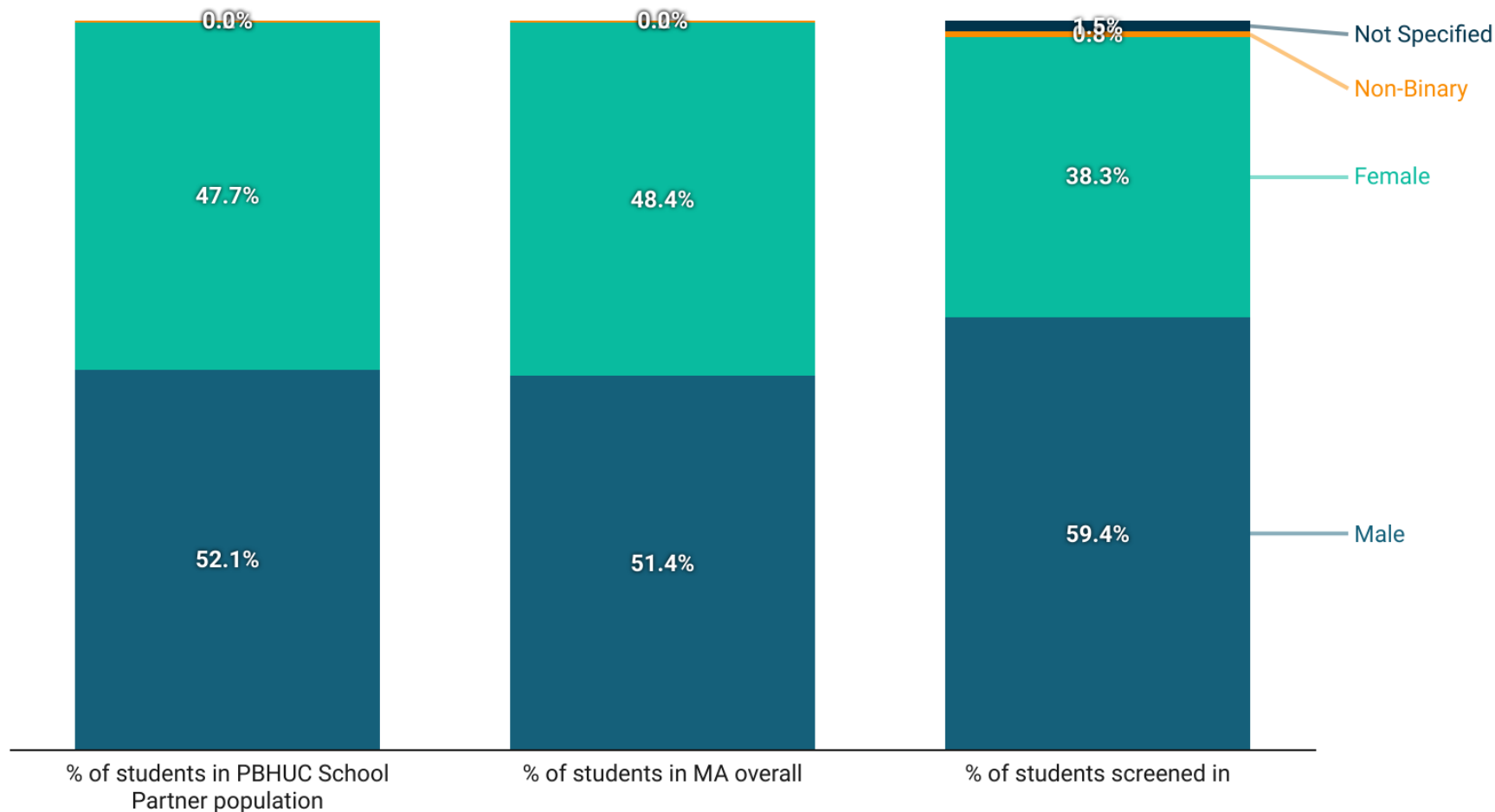

Students in the PBHUC Program versus MA overall versus Students Screened in to the PBHUC Program, 2023



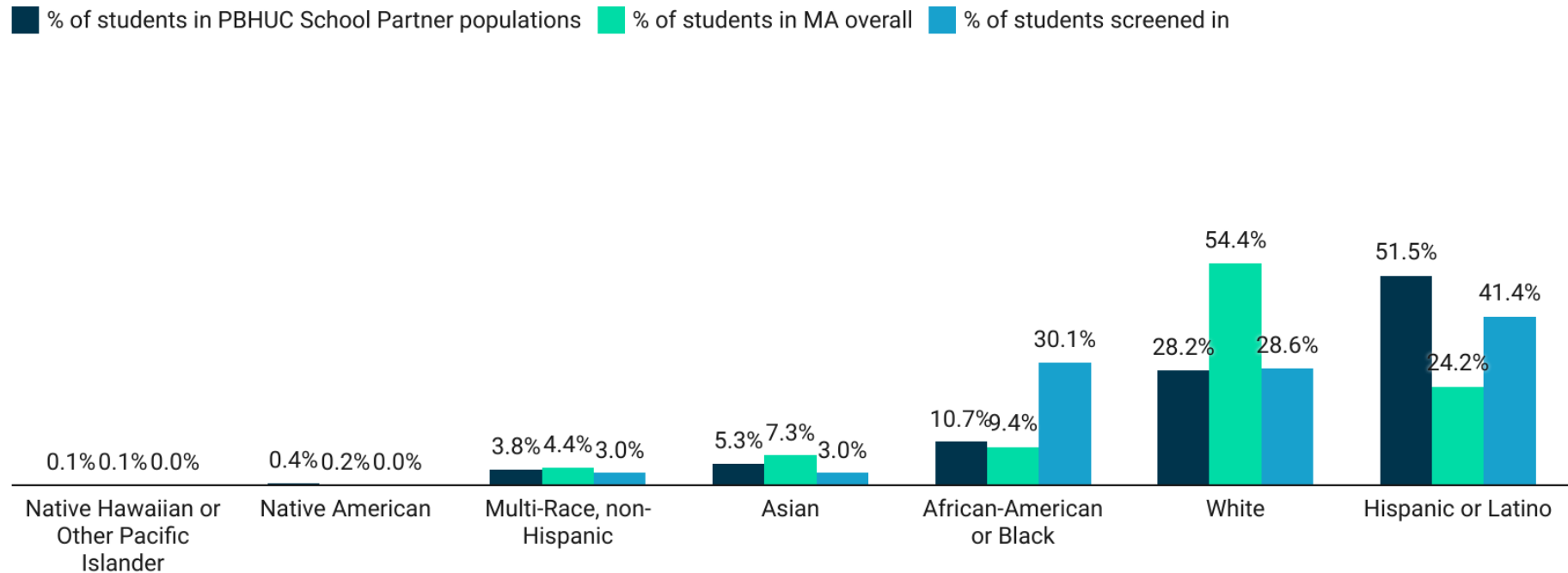

Note: Demographic data for PBHUC partner schools and MA were pulled from publicly available data on DESE's website. Income data were available for 91 (of 133) students who were screened in from January - June 2023. DESE defines "low-income" students as student who participate in one or more of the following state-administered programs: the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP); the Transitional Assistance for Families with Dependent Children (TAFDC); the Department of Children and Families' (DCF) foster care program; expanded MassHealth (Medicaid) up to 185% of the federal poverty level, as well as students identified by districts as homeless and students the district confirmed had met the low-income criteria through the supplemental process and collected the required supporting documentation. However, school partners may have used a different definition for the students who were screened in.

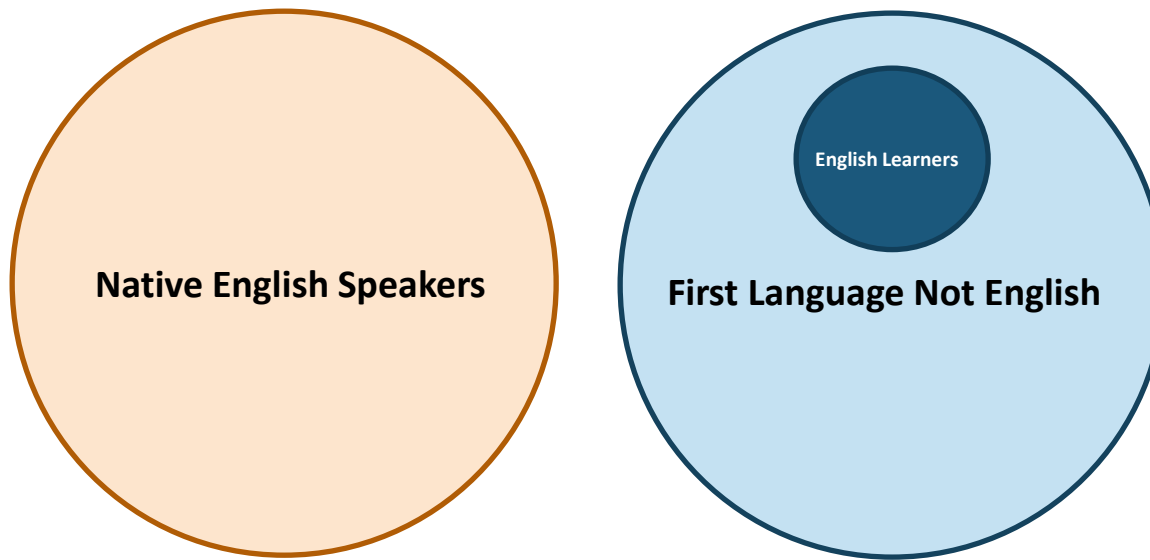
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DESE Language Designation

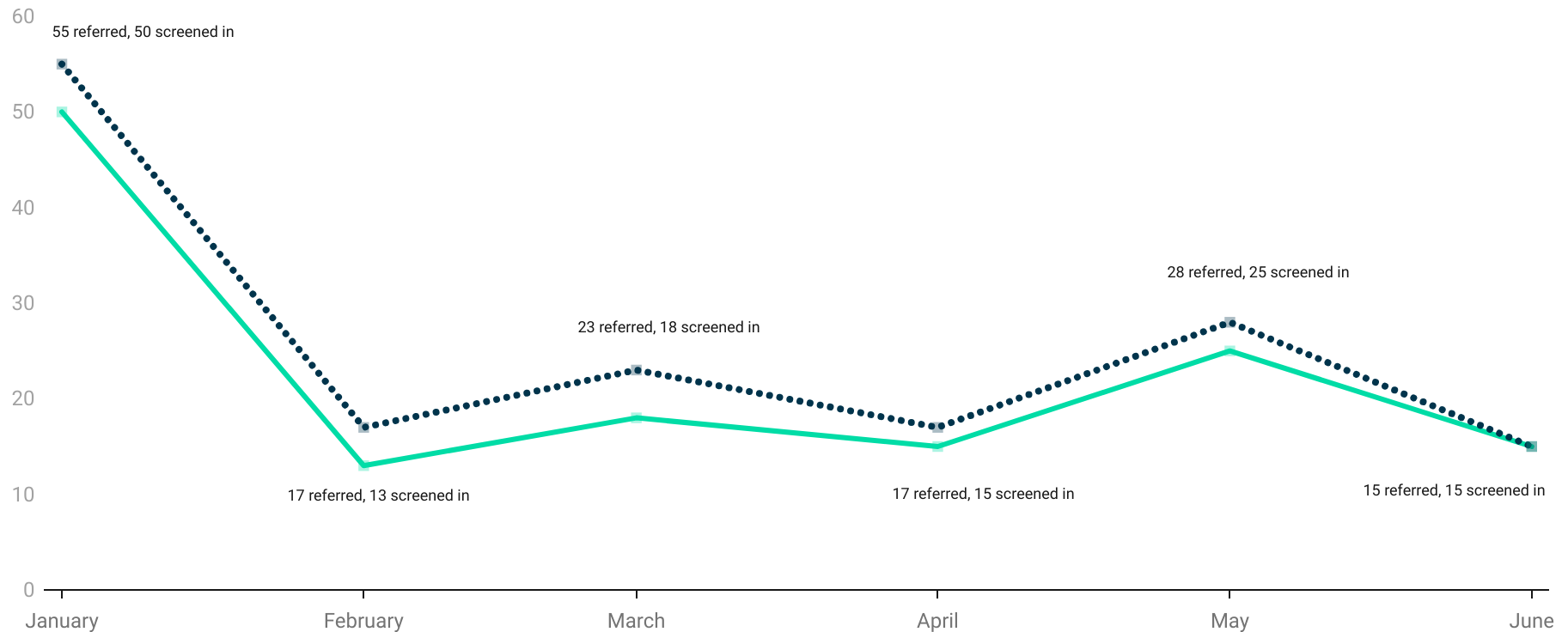

• Total number of referred students — Total number of screened in students

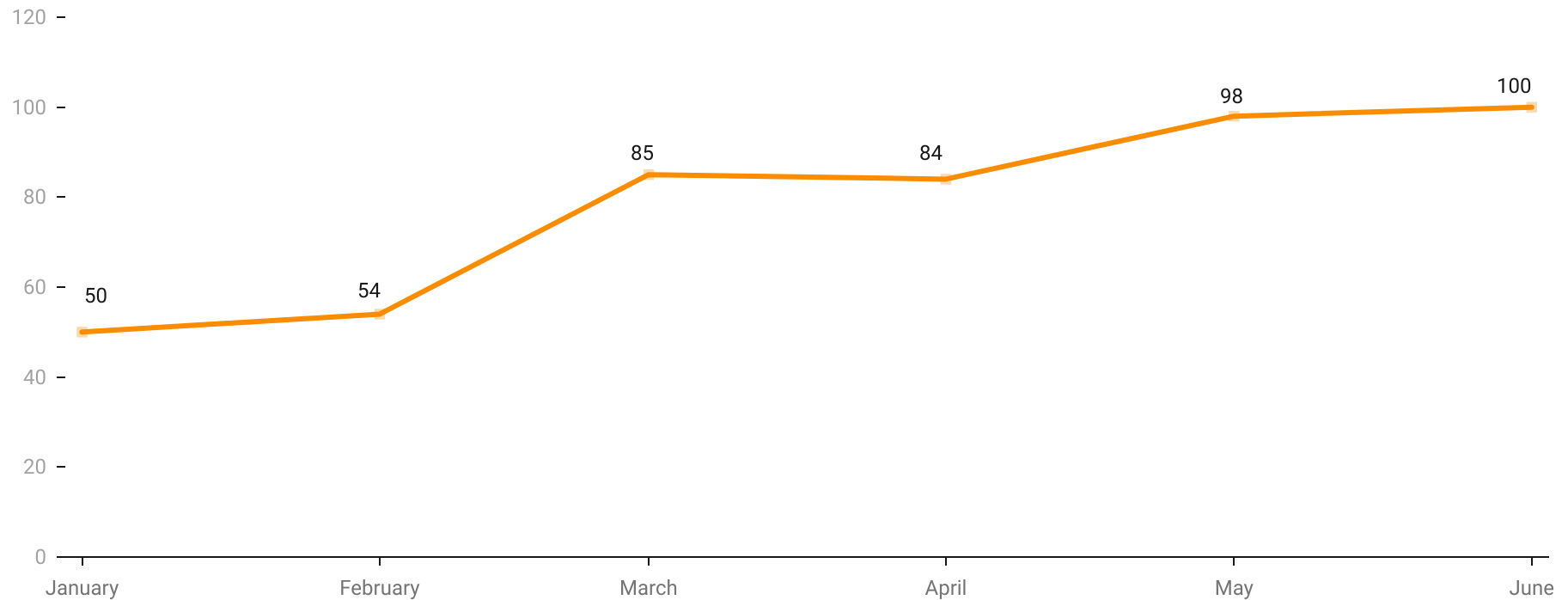

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Students Receiving Services Under the PBHUC Grant, PBHUC Program for January - June 2023

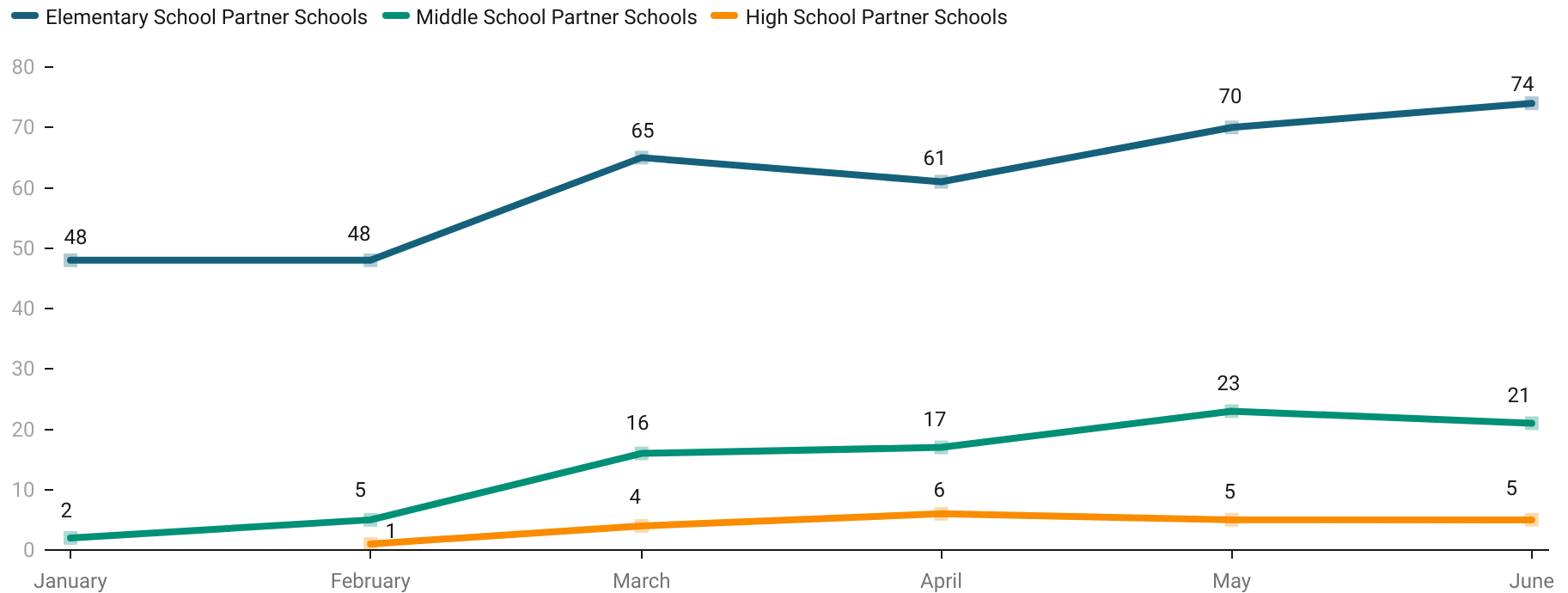

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Students Receiving Services Under the PBHUC Grant by Grade Level, PBHUC Program for January - June 2023

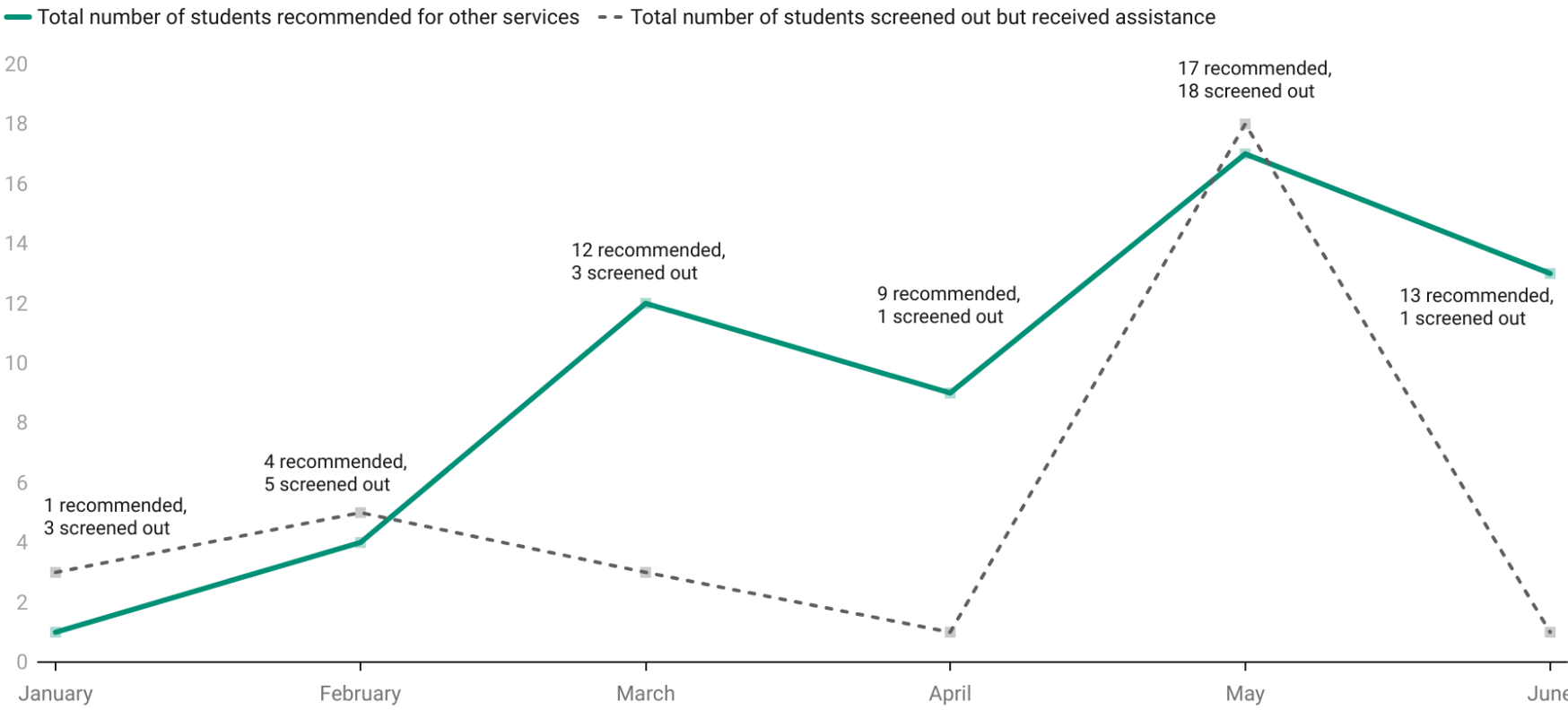

Note: Students may have received multiple types of services across multiple months and were counted once in each of those months. A total of 155 students were referred and 136 received were screened in from January - June 2023 (20 in Weymouth and 38 in Randolph). However, three students were referred and screened in twice across this time so 152 and 133 unique students were referred and screened in, respectively. "Recommended for other services" is defined as the number of students who were screened in and who were recommended for services from another provider, organization, or agency (other than your CBHC or from the grant-funded staff). These services can include behavioral health services, social services, or other kinds of support services. "Screened out but received assistance" is defined as the number of students who were not screened in but received some sort of assistance from grant-funded staff. This assistance could include, for example, providing a pamphlet for a service, assistance for a family member but not the student, or providing them with a website for more information about a service.
